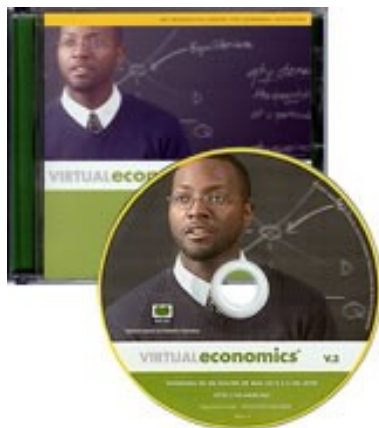


COURSE OBJECTIVES:

BECOME A GUFFEY SCHOLAR, RECEIVE REDUCED TUITION

Attention Nebraska Teachers!

One hundred dollars per credit hour (\$100) of the tuition for each course will be reimbursed by the UNL Center for Economic Education to qualifying Nebraska teachers who apply for and receive the Guffey Economic Education Scholarship(s).

Guffey Scholarships are available to first 5 **Nebraska teachers** who pre-register in **each course**. This scholarship makes the final cost of each 1 credit course approximately **\$242.00**.

Current graduate tuition is \$261.75 per credit hour plus fees of \$60.35 for the 1 credit course, totaling \$322.10, before the scholarship. These costs do not include the summer session registration fee of \$20 or graduate admission application fee of \$45.

You could potentially earn 3 graduate credits this summer at a highly reduced rate!

How to apply for the Guffey Scholarship:

Guffey Scholarship applicants must write a short essay addressing the following two statements:

- a) Why you should be selected as a Guffey Scholar?
- b) How will this course help you advance your students' level of economic literacy?

Scholarships are limited and available to the first **5 Nebraska teachers** in each course so complete the online application **TODAY**. Educators may receive multiple scholarships if registering for more than one course. Course Descriptions:

Economics is a subject matter that is also relevant to our personal and social lives and what better way to relate basic economic concepts than through a visit to the zoo, or integrated in the topics of U.S. History or the entertainment industry. At an early age, children encounter many basic economic principles without any knowledge of the discipline. These courses are designed to teach some of these basic concepts and skills within these contexts.

The classes will focus on a selection of fundamental economic concepts. These classes are designed for educators with little or no academic training in economics. However, teachers with a solid background in economics will find the application to topics such as the zoo, U.S. History, music and movies valuable.

EASY REGISTRATION
