Course Descriptions:

Economics is a subject matter that is also relevant to our personal and social lives and what better way to relate basic economic concepts than through a visit to the zoo, or integrated in the topics of U.S. History or the entertainment industry. At an early age, children encounter many basic economic principles without any knowledge of the discipline. These courses are designed to teach some of these basic concepts and skills within these contexts.

The classes will focus on a selection of fundamental economic concepts. These classes are designed for educators with little or no academic training in economics. However, teachers with a solid background in economics will find the application to topics such as the zoo, U.S. History, music and movies valuable.
